Other services that were deemed non-essential followed school closures, as the province went into lockdown. We were faced with unique challenges never seen before in our 69 years of operation. We had some difficult decisions to make which included the new, recently arrived Lattitude Volunteers going home to New Zealand, the cancellation of inperson Spring Outdoor School Programs and rental bookings. Through these challenges, a window of opportunity was created as we had the chance to re-evaluate our programs and services, began thinking outside of the normal parameters and transitioned to online programming.

Overnight programs are still prohibited. Many kids are feeling the effects of isolation and the reduction of social interactions due to the COVID-19 pandemic and we feel the summer camp experience is more important than ever.
